Vocabulary Builder: Parts of a ship




Overview:


This worksheet presents vocabulary related to the parts of a ship.

In this lesson, you will:

- ✓ use vocabulary related to ships
- 1) Let's learn the sides of a ship. Write the words from the box in the correct space.



2) Now let's learn the parts of an amphibious assault ship. Match the words in the box to each part.



Some of these parts are also in other types of ship. Write them below:

Bridge, propeller

Notes: If necessary, explain that a few ships in some navies do not have a propeller, but this is an exception.
