Vocabulary Builder - Types of Army Weapons (Infantry)

Overview:

This worksheet lists vocabulary for types of weapons used by the army.

In this vocabulary builder, you will:

- ✓ use vocabulary related to types of army weapons.
- 1) Label the weapons. Use the words in the box below (continues next page).

weapon (n) /'wepən/ - Something people use for fighting or protection e.g. a knife, a bomb.

> * The machine gun and submachine gun are different weapons but students may get confused. There are differences in use; basically 'sub' in this case means smaller. Submachine guns use smaller bullets. If a student asks, you could ask the class, as it's likely a student will know the difference and they can explain to the rest of the class.





Explain to students that this picture has two answers.

The rifle is called a Steyr EF88 and the extra part (item d) is the grenade launcher.

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- 4) Talk to your partners and discuss the questions.
 - a. Which of the weapons do you know how to use?
 - b. When and where did you use them?
 - c. Which have you NOT used before?
 - d. Which of the weapons from this lesson can you find in the army of your country?

Before having students discuss these questions alone model a question and response with stronger students or elicit a possible answer from the class e.g. Q 4a. What weapons do you know how to use? I know how to use an <u>assault rifle.</u>
