2) Now let's listen to the words practised in this worksheet. Listen and repeat.




3) Find the following words in the puzzle. Words are hiding 📥 🚽

4) Some parts of Australia are very cold in Winter, Spring, and Autumn. Can you choose which service uniforms are for Summer and which are for Winter? Discuss with your partners why.







1. Ask ss why uniform 9 is worn year round (because there is only one type of mess dress). Also, tell ss Each service has their own version of the mess dress, but the one in the picture is Army.

5) Look again at the uniforms. Can you guess which branch they serve in? Army, Navy, or Air Force? Write the numbers in each box. Discuss with your partners why.





6) Test your partner. Point to different uniform parts below and ask him/her to say what it is. For example:



Dress of the Day is what the Commanding Officer (CO) tells his/her personnel to wear. Work with a partner. Can you give examples of dress of the day in your unit/base? E.g. On Mondays and Wednesdays, we have to wear cams.

Suggestion to use the video: engage student in the topic by playing the video at the beginning of the lesson. Before playing ask them "Is your uniform comfortable? What do you like/don't like about your uniform? Then tell them they're going to watch a video about a new uniform for the Australian Army. Ask them what differences there are from the old model. Ans: different colour tone, a new style shirt, lighter fabric, more pockets, better knee pads (they are removable).

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
